



Monthly Plan Premium for People who get Extra Help from Medicare to Help Pay for their Prescription Drug Costs

If you get extra help from Medicare to help pay for your Medicare prescription drug plan costs, your monthly plan premium will be lower than what it would be if you did not get extra help from Medicare. The amount of extra help you get will determine your total monthly plan premium as a member of our Plan.

To qualify for 2019, your yearly income had to be at or below \$18,735 (\$25,365 for a married couple), and your resources had to be worth no greater than \$14,390 (\$28,720 for a married couple). These dollar amounts change from year to year.

You automatically qualify if you have Medicare and at least one of the following applies to you.

- Have full Medicaid benefits
- Get help from Medicaid with paying your Part B premium
- Get Supplemental Security Income

*This does not include any Medicare Part B premium you may have to pay.

Simplete's premium includes coverage for both medical services and prescription drug coverage.
